1 22 January 1953

Comb Gill - Glaciated Slabs

The Team was called out on Thursday afternoon to carry down Mr Anthony Batchelor of Aylesbury.

2 7 August 1953 17:30 Helvellyn - Whelpside Gill

Called out to bring down a gentleman (58 yrs), Mr R L Cutgrove, West Mersea, Essex, who had collapsed. On arriving we learnt he had died and we brought his body down to Wythburn to a waiting ambulance.

3 16 August 1953 20:00 Skiddaw - Dead Crags

Team called out to a gentleman, Edward Simper, Lorton Road, Cockermouth, who was supposed to have fallen down a gully on Dead Crags, but found he had died from natural causes on Netlass Fell behind Skiddaw. Body brought down by the Team to Peter's Lane to await transport to Cockermouth.

4 13 October 1953 12:00 Sty Head area

Call out and search for missing walker involving 200 people. Missing person not found after a 2-day search and then the full weekend. Remains found on 6 February 1955.
