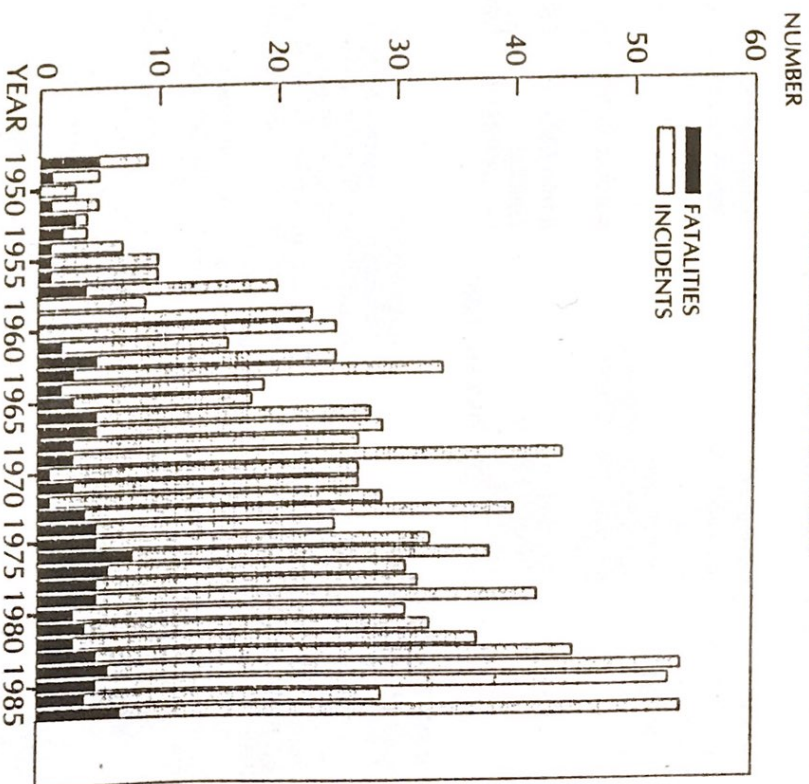

## Incidents 1987

1987 for Keswick Mountain Rescue Team was its busiest year with 54 callouts involving 7 fatalities, plus another 8 calls involving our dog handlers in other areas.

27 people lost their lives in the Lake District in 1987 - the highest on record. This represented 1 in 10 out of the total numbers involved in mountain rescue incidents. The message is clear. If you ever need to call out a mountain rescue team, the chances are 1 in 10 that you are involved with a fatality. Alarming perhaps, but remember that the figures are still low considering the numbers of people who take their pleasure in the mountains.

For Keswick Mountain Rescue Team in 1987, Blencathra was the mountain of the year - hence the picture on the cover. We had 6 incidents here, mostly on Sharp Edge. This previously under-rated mountain is at last gaining a deserved popularity. Enjoy the mountains but tread carefully.

1	Sat. 3rd Jan. 1540	Ashness - Walla Crag footpath
2	Sat. 10th Jan. 1600	Window Gully Great End
3	Tues. 20th Jan. 1615	Cat Gill Falcon Crag

Man slipped on an icy patch, fracturing his ankle. Weather cold, icy and clear.

Climber (22 yrs.) slipped while retrieving a dropped glove and fell, knocking off another climber below. Both went 300'. 1st climber sustained a broken leg, rib, hand and head injuries. The other walked away with minor cuts and bruises. Helicopter on exercise in the area was diverted to the scene. Weather cold and icy. Some snow.

Boy (14 yrs.) in school party of 61, slipped on greasy rock on descent of footpath, fracturing his ankle. Overcast, mild and damp.

Man (26 yrs.) slipped and fell 100'. He had been making geological maps of the area for 6 years and failed to return. An extensive search by 3 teams and 13 SARDA handlers found his *body* at the head of Southerndale. Damp and misty.

Man (23 yrs.) slipped and fell over 500' when off-route with 2 friends. His fall was *fatal*. Another remained cragfast but the other managed to climb off. A party of 7 who were trying to find Cust's Gully or the Band footpath(?). Damp and misty. Hard and slippery underfoot. Casualty had bendy boots with poor tread.

2 parties of 7 (16 - 20 yrs.) reported missing on navigation exercise in poor weather. Last heard on CB radios at 1600 hrs. when lost. Requested to assist Langdale/Ambleside team. 3 turned up in Langdale at 2045 hrs. Others found at 2245 hrs. with mild exposure, one with minor leg injuries.

Man (22 yrs.) fell 30' while leading climb. He sustained head injuries although wearing a helmet.

Boy (16 yrs.) became separated from his party when tired, and failed to return to Wasdale. Requested by Wasdale MRT to assist in search. Found by Search Dog handler near Wasdale Head. Wet and misty.

Boy (16 yrs.) failed to turn up at youth hostel. Route unknown. Large scale search possible due to annual SARDA course being held in Keswick. 14 dogs used and 30 personnel. Boy found at Bleaberry Tarn having been benighted. Clear, cold, calm night.

Climber (32 yrs.) fell 200' from top pitch of climb sustaining a compressed fracture of his cervical vertebrae, a broken tibia, cuts and bruises. His second had understood him to have abandoned the climb.



11	Sun. 22nd Mar. 1420	Great Crag Rostwaite	Woman (55 yrs.) slipped on wet grass and broke her ankle. Damp day with snowy patches.
12	Thurs. 2nd Apr. 1545	Castle Crag	Woman (60 yrs.) slipped on a tree root and broke her ankle. Weather damp.
13	Thurs. 9th Apr. 1545	Outerside	Man (62 yrs.) suffered a suspected heart attack. He managed to walk down before the arrival of the Team and the helicopter. Weather damp.
14	Fri. 17th Apr. 1445	High Spy near Dale Head Tarn	Man (46 yrs.) found to be <i>dead</i> on arrival of the team. He had been walking alone and had been seen to collapse. Passing walkers failed to revive him. Warm and sunny.
15	Sun. 19th Apr. 1415	Drum House track to Green Gable	Man (64 yrs.) collapsed, walking with his 2 sons. Efforts to revive him had failed. Found to be <i>dead</i> on arrival of the team. Very windy, cold and wet.
16	Tues. 21st Apr. 1715	Beckstones Gill Barf	Woman suffering from chest pains was recovered and taken to Keswick Hospital. Clear and sunny.
17	Tues. 21st Apr. 1715	1000' Boulder Sty Head path	Man found semi-conscious after an epileptic fit. He was taken to Keswick Hospital for observation and was detained for two nights.
18	Fri. 24th Apr. 1435	Base Brown above Taylorgill	Man (25 yrs.) slipped and fell 30' while scrambling down after getting separated from his two companions. He sustained 2 arm fractures, cuts and bruises.
19	Fri. 22nd May 1730	Swinside area	Search for schizophrenic, depressed woman (63 yrs.) missing from Derwent Bank since midnight on Wednesday. She turned up in a Workington hotel at the weekend.
20	Mon. 25th May 1115	1000' boulder Sty Head track	Woman (27 yrs.) slipped and fell on gravelly path with heavy rucksack, sustaining a spiral fracture of her leg. Fine and sunny.
21	Mon. 25th May 1945	White Horse, Broad End, Skiddaw	Man (64 yrs.) collapsed on walk with family. He was found to be <i>dead</i> on arrival of the Team. Weather fine and sunny.
22	Thurs. 28th May 1540	Rowling End Causey Pike	Girl (13 yrs.) in school party from Stair hostel slipped on path and broke her leg. Rain showers.
23	Wed. 10th June 1440	Carl Side col Skiddaw	Boy (13 yrs.) in school party staying at Keswick Youth Hostel reported unconscious having slipped on steep, stoney path. He was taken by helicopter to West Cumberland Hospital where he was detained. Damp and misty.
24	Sat. 13th June 1540	Shepherd's Chimney Shepherd's Crag	Girl (14 yrs.) fell 30' on to ledge while leading the 3rd pitch of the climb. She was lowered by other climbers in the area to the foot of the climb. Taken to Keswick Hospital for treatment. Weather fair.



25	Sun. 14th June 1025	Troutdale Pinnacle Superdirect	Woman fell 10' from the 1st pitch of the climb while leading. The first runner came out and she was held by her second runner. She sustained a complicated fracture of her R patella. To add insult to injury, she later found that her car had been broken into.
26	Sun. 14th June 1238	Knott Rigg Newlands	Man (65 yrs.) reported by his wife to be suffering from chest pains. He was found to be in some distress, so a helicopter in the area was diverted. He was airlifted to West Cumberland Hospital and detained in the Coronary Care Unit. He died 2 weeks later. Cool with sunny periods.
27	Wed. 17th June 1453	Walla Crag/ Brackenrigg	2 jets, a Tornado and a Jaguar flying from opposite directions collided over Walla Crag. The Tornado landed across the Borrowdale road, the crew ejecting to safety in Great Wood. The Jaguar broke up in mid-air and landed near Brackenrigg, <i>killing</i> its pilot. Weather sunny and clear.
28	Wed. 1st July 1715	Kinn Grisedale Pike	Youth (18 yrs.) reported to have injured leg near top of Grisedale Pike. Eventually located on Kinn with a strained groin. Weather fair.
29	Sun. 5th July 1403	Fitz Park Keswick	Man (61 yrs.) suffered from a severe attack of angina while the Team was standing by on the annual Skiddaw Race. He was treated and taken to the Intensive Care Unit at Carlisle. Very hot and sunny.
30	Sun. 5th July 1600	Skiddaw summit	Woman taking part in the Skiddaw Race slipped and fell sustaining a cut and bruised knee and wrist. She was escorted down by the Team. Very hot and sunny.
31	Thurs. 9th July 1600	Mortician Black Crag	Man fell 10' on the third pitch sustaining a complicated fracture of his leg. He was lowered to the foot of the crag by other climbers before being evacuated by the team.
32	Sat. 11th July 1717	Donkey's Ears Shepherd's Crag	Man (18 yrs.) fell 40' while scrambling down after climbing with young people. He sustained a broken leg and arm and injuries to his back. Dry and warm.
33	Sun. 26th July 1600	Coldbarrow Fell Dock Tarn	Man (51 yrs.) in walking party reported to be suffering from chest pains. He was located with difficulty in bad visibility and was later reported to be poorly in hospital.
34	Tues. 28th July 2005	Swan Dub Langstrath	Girl (14 yrs.) taking part in her Duke of Edinburgh's Award Expedition slipped and sprained her ankle. She and the rescue team were well looked after by her friends. Showery day, dry for the evacuation.
35	Wed. 29th July 1730	Sharp Edge Blencathra	German man slipped about 60' off the Edge sustaining multiple abrasions, lacerated scalp, leg and arm injuries. He managed to regain the Edge but then collapsed. He was carried down with difficulty as he weighed about 18 stones. Warm, dry day.
36	Thurs. 3rd Aug 1650	Mousethwaite Comb Blencathra	2 girls in a youth group were poly-bagging together in the same bag down the head of the Comb on steep grass. They went about 150'. One sustained shock only but the other received severe bruising to her back and neck. Day of heavy showers.



## Keswick Mountain Rescue Team 40 years of mountain rescue

By the end of 1987, its 40th year, Keswick Mountain Rescue Team had successfully completed over 1034 recorded rescues and searches, with an additional 34 incidents being credited to the team's dog handlers in other areas. Sadly, since 1949, as many as 130 people have lost their lives in our area, but more often than not, it can be considered that there is no finer way to end one's days.

40 years on, the Team still has two of its founder members - George Fisher and Richard Fisher. George was Team Leader for 35 years and was involved in over 800 rescues. In 1983 he received an MBE for his services to mountain rescue. Richard is still an every day active member. Over its 40 years, the Team has received the generous and selfless service of 244 members.

| <p>1946 Wilfrid Noyce broke his leg on the Shark's Fin, Great Gable. The rescue took 21 hours. As a result, Rusty Westmorland decided to form an organised mountain rescue team.</p> <p>1949 The Borrowdale Mountain Rescue Team was formed.</p> <p>1950 It was decided to write to a casualty to see if he was prepared to meet his rescue expenses.</p> <p>1952 Lighting equipment was purchased costing £7/5/0d.</p> <p>1954 A Humber shooting brake was purchased for £145.3 good tyres and 1 fair one. Battery O.K. 15-20 mpg. Seating for 11.</p> <p>1956 The Treasurer is to buy 2¼ bottles of brandy to replace the port wine in the rucksacks.</p> <p>1958 The Team ambulance was in a bad way and was a risk to drive.</p> <p>1960 A press account of a night rescue said that 'a large fire was lit in the mountain to enable the rescuers to see.'</p> | <p>1961 The Medical Officer mentioned that it had become the fashion to discredit the use of alcohol for exposure, exhaustion and shock. He reminded members that though they had in 15 years brought down 138 casualties, many of whom had had brandy, all who had been alive when picked up were brought down alive.</p> <p>1964 RSPCA Certificate of Merit received for animal rescues. 200 animals estimated to have been rescued.</p> <p>1968 It was decided to elongate the Land Rover by 2 feet, to put in side windows and to make accommodation for 2 stretchers at a cost of about £200.</p> <p>1970 A portable generator with searchlight was purchased. It weighed 18lbs, ran for 1 hour on ⅔ pint and had a beam of 400 yards. (This was carried on a member's back).</p> <p>1974 Rusty Westmorland retired as executive head of the Team after 27 years.</p> <p>1976 Reviva hot air apparatus purchased with donations received in memory of two boys who died on Scafell Pike.</p> <p>1981 George Fisher retired as Team Leader for 35 years. Woman (69 yrs.) walking on her own was reported to have fallen from Sharp Edge. She suffered from multiple injuries and was flown by a helicopter in the area to West Cumberland Hospital. Wet day.

Youth (17 yrs.) failed to return from a walk up the valley from Stonethwaite campsite at 1.30 p.m. wearing only a T-shirt and shorts. He turned up again just before midnight. Warm, dry night.

Woman was recovered suffering from a broken ankle. Warm, dry day.

Boy scout (15 yrs.) on a Chief Scout Challenge walk slipped and injured his knee. He was located with difficulty in poor visibility having gone to ground in a sheepfold.

Man collapsed on footpath. The team was requested to assist the ambulance crew who were also attending another incident. A wet day.

Man reported to be suffering from vertigo at the head of the valley. He was found near Black Moss Pot. He was taken to Keswick Hospital. Thought possibly to be a mild stroke.

Man (56 yrs.) reported to have collapsed. He was found wandering down the path in spite of having suffered a mild coronary attack. Dry and cool.

Woman slipped and fell over 100' on descent from the Edge to an easier path and suffered multiple injuries. She was lowered 200' to easier ground. Her husband and two young sons (10 and 12 yrs.) were also taken off in darkness. Dry and cool.

Woman slipped on wet grass and broke her leg. She was carried down and taken to hospital. Wet.

2 coach loads of students from Durham University Mountaineering Club reported 2 students to be overdue from a walk to Scafell Pike. The search was abandoned when it was discovered that the students had turned up in Wasdale.

4 girls (16 yrs.) from West Cumbria College became separated after 2 of them refused to move when in steep ground. Their supervisors had been unable to find them. Found by the team after a short search. The girls had remained there for 10 hours!

Man with a broken leg on a walk to Skiddaw House in good weather.

Man fell about 25' and sustained minor head injuries. He had been escorted from the crag by the Civil Ambulance Crew on arrival of the Team.



50	Sat. 14th Nov. 2015	Sprinkling Tarn	3 girls from Somerset College of Art and Technology were reported to be sheltering in a tent at the Tarn, one with knee injuries and suffering from exposure. One was carried down, the others escorted on foot.
51	Sun. 29th Nov. 1615	Glenderamackin Blencathra	Man (61 yrs.) fell 100' into Doddick Gill in a moment of lapsed concentration and received <i>fatal</i> injuries. A helicopter was called and used in the evacuation of the body. Fine, frosty weather.
53	Sun. 13th Dec. 2030	Scafell Pike	2 boys (18 yrs. & 16 yrs.) were reported overdue when they failed to rendezvous after the school party had split up on the Corridor Route. A search was made all night in freezing conditions. The boys turned up safe and well in Eskdale the next morning.
54	Thurs. 31st Dec. 0730	Scafells/ Langdales	Father (43 yrs.) and son (16 yrs.) reported missing after a walk over the Scafells in very wet and windy weather. A search involving 13 SARDA dogs and an RAF helicopter was mounted by Langdale/Ambleside MRT. The missing persons turned up at midday back at their car having spent a wild night out.

1	Thurs 7th May 2245	Cockermouth	Team dogs requested by Cockermouth MRT to assist in search for man (79 yrs.) reported missing from home. Found next morning with mild hypothermia. Later <i>died</i> .
2	Wed. 13th May 2225	Langdale Pikes	Team dogs requested by Langdale/Ambleside MRT to assist in search for man (68 yrs.) who had failed to return from a walk in poor weather. He was found <i>dead</i> next day north of Pike of Stickle. Wet and cold.
3	Mon. 8th June	Nether Row Fellside	Car found abandoned overnight. Occupants thought to be lost. Search called off when they were found to have been camping.
4	Wed. 15th July 0030	Greenhow End Deepdale	Man (30's) reported missing from his group on walk. Keswick dogs requested to assist in search. <i>Body</i> found by search dog at foot of the crag.
5	Tues. 18th Aug. 0030	Scafell area	Man who had walked to Scafell Pike from Langdale had failed to return. A search was made and the man turned up in Langdale at 0300 hrs. Warm night.
6	Fri. 2nd Oct. 0500	Dent area	Team dogs requested by Kendal MSRT to assist in search for man (56 yrs.) reported missing in the Dent area. He was found at first light having been benighted.
7	Tues. 13th Oct. 2015	Bowfell/Crinkles Langdale	Team dogs requested by Langdale/Ambleside MRT to assist in search for a man (63 yrs.) with a heart condition who was overdue on a walk. He turned up unharmed in Eskdale having joined up with 2 other walkers. Heavy showers.
8	Sun. 1st Nov. 0015	Haweswater area	Team dogs requested by Penrith MRT to assist in search for man (55 yrs.) reported overdue from walk. 7 team and SARDA searched all night. The <i>body</i> was found in the morning by helicopter half way down some crags.
