### Team Leader's Report

53 Callouts this year, this seems to be our average number these last few years. The type of rescue also follows its usual pattern, a lot of slips with the resulting injuries to legs or arms, a few climbing accidents, and a few searches for overdue walkers or climbers. Our Search Dog members, of which we have four, have been called out of the area to assist other teams, notably to Lockerbie this year - a very traumatic experience for all of them.

Although the majority of our rescues require men with strong legs and backs to carry stretchers over rough ground for long distances, there are times when we have to rescue climbers or walkers off crags, so it is good that we have a percentage of regular climbers in the team and that all of us practice regularly, lowering stretchers etc. To this end, our Training Officer devises a programme of weekly practices to keep us sharp.

Although we had few searches this year, the numbers do not reflect the number of times that the Police contacted the leader or the deputies, usually late evening, with reports of overdue walkers. Our practice, depending on weather, strength of party, equipment etc. is to give the walkers plenty of time to walk in, usually up to midnight and then initiate a dog search, then if they have not been found, the Team or teams turn out at first light.

Invariably 90% of the time, that three or four hours wait before calling the dogs works and the delayed walkers walk in. But the pressure on the Team by the understandably concerned relatives or friends is great and this should be remembered by the people who sometimes accuse teams of being over zealous.

I must once again take this opportunity to thank all our Patrons, Collecting Box Holders and all who gave donations for all their generous support.

A simulated plane crash with five casualties spread over an area of woodland proved interesting, and provided a variety of problems. All five were soon found by a local search dog. After being given the necessary First Aid each was evacuated to the road.

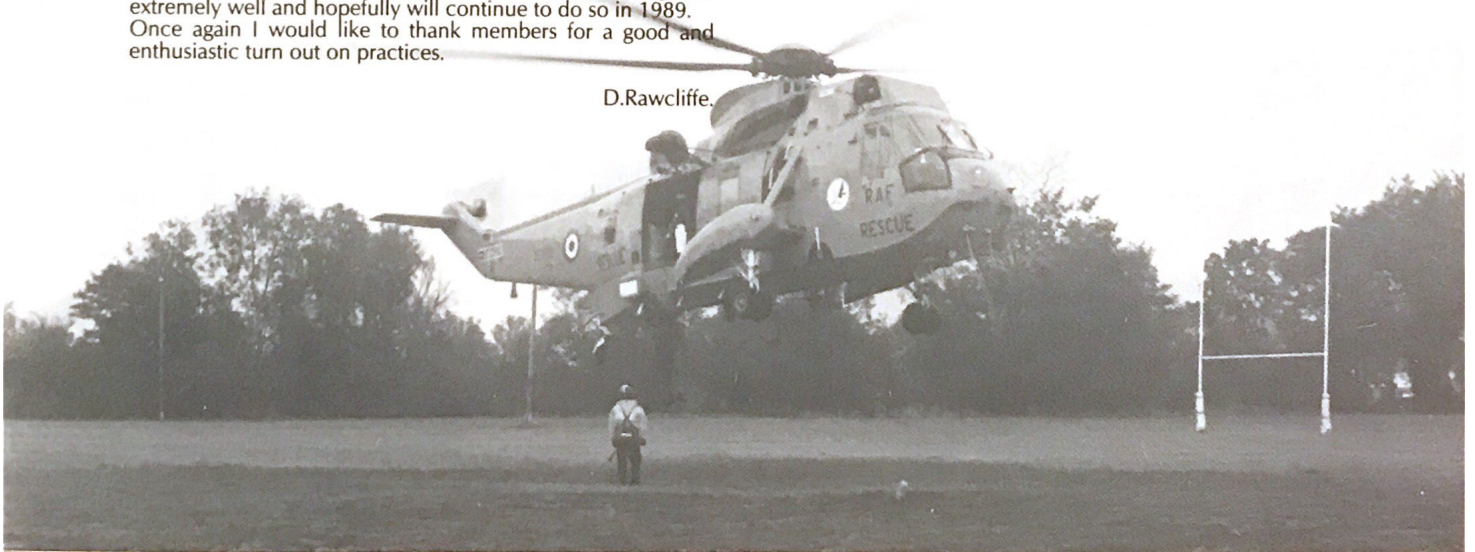
Most of the Summer practices were held on various crags and included a spectacular 300ft free abseil from the top of Raven Crag, Thirlmere.

| 1  | Sat. 16th Jan.<br>1615 | Grains Gill                             | Man (52 yrs) slipped and dislocated his right knee. He was assisted some way down by friends before the arrival of the team. Dry, mild weather.  |
| 2  | Wed. 27th Jan.<br>1515 | Scales Fell,<br>Blencathra              | Man (20 yrs) was practising ice axe braking near the top of the mountain when he caught a crampon tip in the snow. This caused him to break his leg. Cold with cloud at 2000'.   |
| 3  | Sat. 6th Feb.<br>1310  | Eel Crag,<br>Coledale Hause             | Man (30 yrs) separated from group slipped and fell about 200' down a snow slope. He may have been blown off his feet. He was airlifted by helicopter to West Cumberland Hospital but found to be dead on arrival. Dry, windy day. Assisted by Cockermouth MRT. |
| 4  | Wed. 24th Feb.<br>1530 | Miner's Crag<br>Newlands                | Man in new boots slipped on a patch of ice on the footpath and broke his ankle. A fine, cold day.  |
| 5  | Sat. 5th Mar.<br>1630  | Angle Tarn Gill,<br>Langstrath          | Man (43 yrs) with some Venture Scouts slipped and fell about 20' into the gill, breaking his ankle. He was airlifted to hospital by a helicopter which had just completed another rescue in the area.  |
| 6  | Thu. 17th Mar.<br>1610 | Aaron Slack,<br>Sty Head                | Man was discovered by another walker to be unable to walk down due to an injured knee which had recently been operated on. He was attended to by two members from Patterdale team who were in the area, before being carried down. Dry and overcast.           |
| 7  | Thu. 24th Mar.<br>1125 | Above<br>Ashness Bridge                 | Requested by the Police to assist with a broken leg above the bridge. However, the incident was dealt with by the civilian ambulance and the team was stood down.  |
| 8  | Wed. 30th Mar.<br>1830 | Tarn Crag,<br>Hatrop Tarn               | Girl (Teens) in a Duke of Edinburgh expedition group suffered from a strained thigh and was carried off by the team.   |
| 9  | Sat. 2nd Apr.<br>1100  | Gate Gill,<br>Blencathra                | Man reported to be in distress with chest pains. He had managed to walk some way down before the arrival of the team. Mild and drizzly.  |
| 10 | Sat. 2nd Apr.<br>1620  | Great Dodd                              | Man (51 yrs) reported to have collapsed with a heart attack. He was found to be dead on arrival of the team and was evacuated by helicopter in difficult visibility.   |
| 11 | Wed. 6th Apr.<br>1515  | Path below<br>Falcon Crag               | Woman (60 yrs.) slipped off path and fell about 50' sustaining a broken leg and head injuries. A fine, dry day.  |
| 12 | Wed. 6th Apr.<br>1515  | Crag above<br>King's Head,<br>Thirlspot | Man (25 yrs.) reported to be cragfast whilst scrambling. He was wearing training shoes. He was taken off by the team.  |
| 13 | Wed. 20th Apr.<br>1510 | Little Chamonix,<br>Shepherd's Crag     | Man (32 yrs.) slipped and fell 120' whilst soloing the climb with two friends. He received multiple injuries - a crushed pelvis and wrist, internal and back injuries. Mild and dry. Released from hospital on 9th July.                                       |

14	Sun. 23rd Apr. 1605	Zig Zag, Castle Rock, Thirlmere.	Man (40 yrs.) fell 30' - 40' and sustained head injuries, which were perhaps added to by his helmet! Sunny, dry and warm.
15	Tues. 17th May 2122	MGC, Shepherd's Crag	Man fell about 15' and received minor head and wrist injuries. Cool and overcast.
16	Tues. 31st May 1310	Taylor Gill, Seathwaite	Man slipped and fell whilst scrambling on the path. He sustained a dislocated shoulder, cuts and bruises. Weather fair.
17	Tues. 31st May 1535	Castle Head	Man (62 yrs.) slipped and fell, dislocating his shoulder. He was assisted by other walkers and taken by car to hospital.
18	Sun. 12th Jun. 1455	Helvellyn Gill, Thirlmere	Woman wearing trainers slipped on dusty path and broke her ankle. Hot and sunny day.
19	Mon. 20th Jun. 1455	Watendlath/ Lodore path	Woman tripped and broke her ankle. A fine day.
20	Sun. 26th Jun. 1245	Greenup Edge	Girl (16 yrs.) in youth group, was unable to walk due to injured knee. Wearing plimsolls. A fine day.
21	Sun. 26th Jun. 1750	Greenup Gill	Woman (40 yrs.) in a Rambling Group, with a strained ankle, possibly caused by unfamiliar, new boots.
22	Mon. 11th Jul. 1200	Langstrath	A report from the Rescue Co-ordination Centre at Pitreavie that a light aircraft had gone missing over the Lake District in poor weather. Four helicopters were scrambled. The aircraft, a Cessna 150 was found. Its two occupants escaped with only shock and bruising.
23	Tues. 12th Jul. 1355	Grains Gill	Youth (16 yrs.) was taken ill with abdominal pains while taking part in a Duke of Edinburgh Award Silver expedition. He was carried off and detained in hospital overnight with a kidney infection.
24	Wed. 20th Jul. 1430	Agony, Castle Rock, Thirlmere	Man fell about 100' when handhold gave way, He landed on a ledge 10' from the foot of the climb, suffering a broken leg, pelvis and multiple bruising. Dry and warm.
25	Thu. 21st Jul. 2140	Honister Hause	Request from Ambulance Control to recover an asthmatic casualty from a broken down ambulance.
26	Sat. 23rd Jul. 2330	Langdale/Scafell Pike	Request to assist Langdale/Ambleside team with search dogs looking for two youths (18 yrs.) overdue from a late start to walk to Scafell Pike with minimal equipment. Found benighted in Mickleden. Weather poor and deteriorating.
27	Tue. 9th Aug. 1730	Great Gable Crag, Dale Head	Man (25 yrs.) in a party of six became cragfast. He was taken off unhurt.
28	Mon. 15th Aug. 1430	Little Chamonix, Shepherd's Crag	Youth (14 yrs.) slipped from the bottom of his abseil ledge and fell 30' - 40' receiving fatal head injuries.

29	Fri. 19th Aug. 1650	River Derwent, Borrowdale	Woman slipped and broke her arm on riverside path. She was recovered and taken to hospital.
30	Wed. 24th Aug. 2025	Seathwaite Mine	A party of six students and four instructors were trapped by a roof fall while exploring the old workings.
31st	Tue. 6 Sep. 1830	High Tove	Request by the Police to check a rucksack which had been left by the summit cairn. Search dogs used but nothing found. It had been left in error by a youth group.
32	Mon. 12th Sep. 1830	Greenup Gill	Man (54 yrs.) was taken ill on walk. A helicopter was called to assist but the man had managed to walk some way down unaided. He was found to have a viral infection.
33	Tue. 20th Sep. 1315	Blackmoss Pot, Langstrath	A woman broke her ankle while walking. She was recovered and taken to hospital.
34	Sun. 25th Sep. 1550	Moses' Trod	A woman in a rambling party was blown over with her leg between two rocks. She broke her leg and other party members became very cold in the high winds and driving rain.
35	Sun. 9th Oct. 0400	Scafell area	A party of nine (five adults and four fifteen-year-old girls) attempting the three Peaks were benighted in gale force winds and heavy rain, having left Wasdale Head at 1530 hrs. They were located near Broad Crag Col at 0830 hrs. by a search dog handler.
36	Sun. 16th Oct. 2300	Great Gable, Napes/Honister	Two climbers (21 years and 19 years) missed a rendezvous with two friends on Green Gable after climbing on the Napes. They turned up the following morning at Honister youth hostel having spent the night out. Search dogs and four teams were involved in the search.
37	Mon. 17th Oct. 1600	Blease Fell, Blencathra	A solo walker (62 yrs.) collapsed and died near the summit in fine, sunny weather. Passing walkers had failed to revive him.
38	Mon. 17th Oct. 1230	Sharp Edge, Blencathra	A woman (62 yrs.) slipped and fell about 70' from the Edge into a gully, sustaining multiple injuries. She was lowered from the gully and picked up by a waiting helicopter but was found to be dead on arrival at hospital.
39	Tues. 18th Oct. 1145	High Tove	A girl was reported to have injured her leg. She was located and carried down in heavy rain.
40	Tues. 18th Oct. 1700	Greenup Edge	A youth group was reported to be in difficulties with an exposed group member. They were located sheltering in a tent. One person was carried down. The weather was unpleasant.
41	Tues. 25th Oct. 1410	Cat Bells, North Ridge	A woman (48 yrs.) slipped on wet grass and sustained a broken leg while walking.
42	Wed. 26th Oct. 1450	Scope End, Littledale	A woman (70 yrs.) slipped on wet grass and fell, breaking her leg.



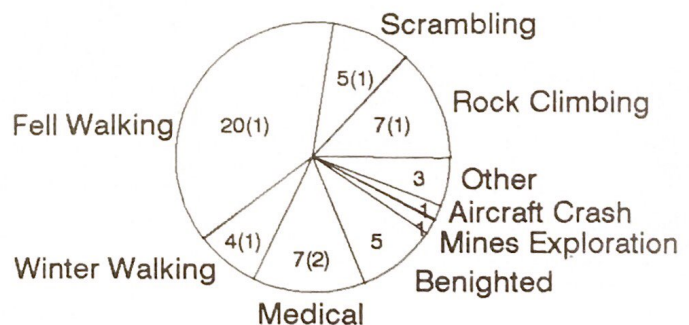
43	Sat. 29th Oct. 1535	King's How	A woman slipped on a patch of ice and injured her ankle. The weather was beautiful but cool.
44	Fri. 4th Nov. 1815	Scafell Pike	A youth (19 yrs.) with no torch was reported missing after leaving Sty Head Tarn at 1230 hours en route for Scafell Pike. The search revealed that he had been seen at Wasdale head at 1430 hrs. He was found next morning under Esk Buttress having been benighted.
45	Sat. 5th Nov. 1205	Doups, Millbeck, Skiddaw	A man (70 yrs.) was reported to be in a collapsed condition. However, he had managed to walk down before arrival of the team.
46	Wed. 9th Nov. 1730	Sharp Edge, Blencathra	The Police requested the team to investigate circumstances surrounding a rucksack which had been seen beneath the Edge. A search, with dogs, revealed nothing. It was later discovered that the rucksack had been dropped by accident and not retrieved because of its inaccessibility.
47	Fri. 11th Nov. 0845	Cust's Gully, Great End	A party of 30 Royal Marines had radioed for help after one of their number had dislodged a rock on to others below. Three sustained cuts and injuries to legs and arms. They were evacuated by helicopter.
48	Sat. 12th Nov. 1730	Troutdale Pinnacle, Black Crag	Two students from N. London Polytechnic. The leader had fallen from the final pitch, pulling out two of three runners. As a result they were both benighted on the climb, although uninjured.
49	Sat. 12th Nov. 1745	Hall's Fell, Blencathra	Two walkers had become split up whilst descending the ridge in darkness. They turned up as the team was starting the search.
50	Mon. 14th Nov. 1600	Vesper, Shepherd's Crag	A climber, having fallen once, fell again from the second pitch. However, his runner failed the second time and he landed at the foot of the climb, sustaining head and shoulder injuries. He was transferred to Newcastle General Hospital.
51	Wed. 7th Dec. 1650	Hobcarton Crag	A solo walker lost his dog, a golden retriever, whilst walking. A quick search in poor weather in the likely area found nothing. The dog was located the next morning, 100' down the crag, and was taken off, none the worse for its experience.
52	Wed. 28th Dec. 1305	Brandlehow, Derwentwater	A woman in her 60's slipped on wet grass and broke her ankle in three places.
53	Thu. 29th Dec. 1310	Latrigg	Another woman slipped on wet grass and broke her ankle.



## Keswick Mountain Rescue Team Search Dog Involvement in Incidents Outside Local Area

1	Mon. 8th Feb. 0630	Patterdale/ Helvellyn area	Search dogs called to assist in search for man (57 yrs.) missing from a walk the previous day in blizzard conditions. Found alive near Red Tarn Beck, but died during his rescue.
2	Fri. 19th Feb. 2300	Pillar area	Search dogs called to assist in search for a party of walkers missing since the previous day. They were found unharmed having been benighted on Great Borne.
3	Thu. 3rd Mar. 0000	Furness area	Search dogs helped look for missing, depressed boy who later turned up in Blackpool.
4	Sun. 25th Sep. 0800	Langdale area	Search dogs called to assist in search for man missing possibly since 7th August. His body was found on 31st December above the New Dungeon Gill Hotel.
5	21st - 28th Dec.	Lockerbie area	Search dogs attended the Panam Boeing 747 jumbo jet crash over several days, finding many bodies.

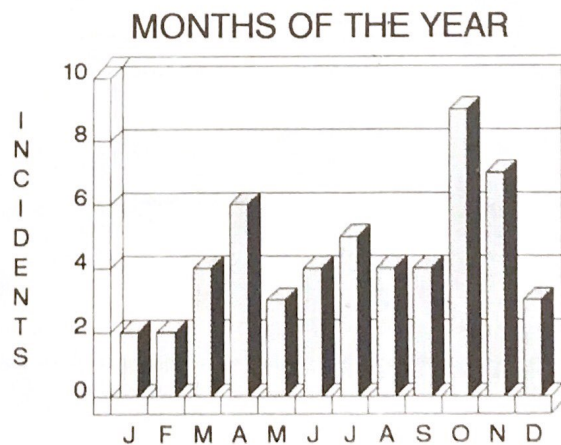
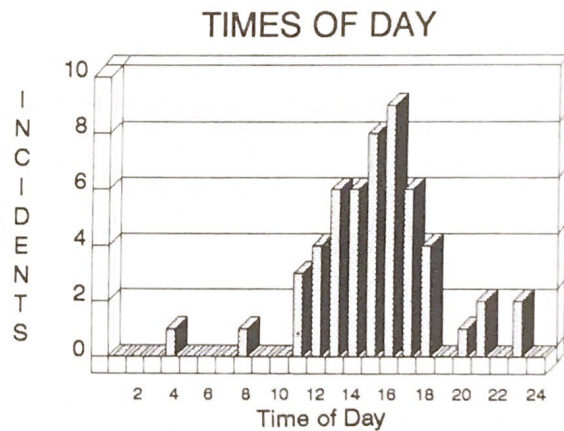
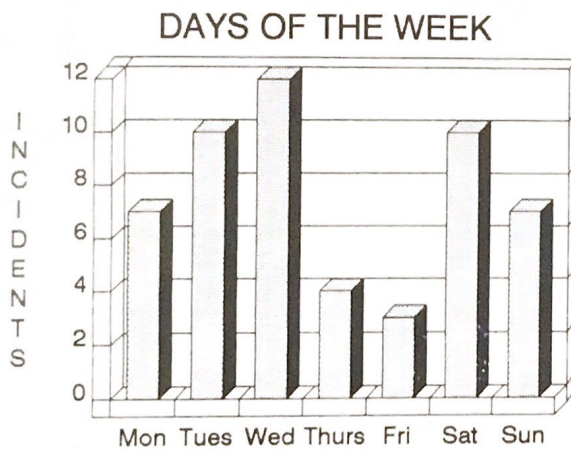
### SUMMARY OF INCIDENT TYPES
