#### **Team Leader's Report**

A quiet start and a busy summer seems to be the pattern over the last few years and 1990 was no exception. 56 Rescues, 26 in July, August and September.

A feature of this year has been the very fast callout response time by team members. I think a number of factors have contributed to this. The issue of Radios to team members either living or working in our two key valleys, Borrowdale and Thirlmere has enabled them to arrive at the casualty with Radio and First Aid, well ahead of the main party. This, coupled with the issue of Telecom Pagers to the Team Leader and deputies, has meant we can get eight or ten of the team away from the base within minutes of the police call. This leaves the controller to call the back-up team by the more conventional, but slower, telephone. Within the next few months, we hope to equip the whole team with

Within the next few months, we hope to equip the whole team with base radio controlled pagers. So even the back-up team's response time will be dramatically reduced.

This will be expensive, but I know we can count on the continuous generous support of our patrons and friends.

A woman slipped and broke an ankle.

A request was received to evacuate a boy to hospital after he suffered a fit.

An elderly couple set off to walk from Threlkeld to Keswick via Latrigg. They ran out of daylight and attempted to make a direct descent to Keswick - becoming trapped on steep ground. They were brought down by the Team.

A hunt follower slipped, injuring his knee. He was carried down and taken to hospital.

A report was received of a car which had been abandoned for 3 days; its owner having failed, apparently, to return from a walk. With heavy snow and high winds already sweeping into the area, an immediate search was initialised while further enquiries were made. As the search was called off for the night, the man returned to his car. He had been walking in the area, staying in bed and breakfast accommodation.

A skier broke an ankle.


A walker reported finding an injured youth lying in a gully in the Robinson Cairn area. Cockermouth MRT requested the Team's assistance when it was found that there was a second casualty further up in the gully. In the difficult evacuation of the casualties, in high winds, snow and darkness, a Keswick team member slipped whilst carrying a stretcher, breaking an ankle.

The numerous "sheep rescues" performed by the Team during the year are recorded as practises and not as callouts.






#### Statistics 1990

The Statistics for 1990 confirm the general trend of an increase in the number of mountain accidents - simply a reflection of the number of people venturing onto the hill. In this context, 56 does not seem to be an excessive number of incidents. People can be too quick to criticise those who require the services of a mountain rescue team, most of the incidents dealt with involve medical conditions or a simple slip - things that can happen to any person at any time. The wary and unwary, the experienced and inexperienced alike can all become a statistic - given a degree of bad luck.


