In Memory of Eric Bates

The estate of Mrs Elizabeth Bates of Barnoldswick, Lancashire, was left to Keswick Mountain Rescue Team in memory of her son, Eric.

The sum of £50,000 was used to buy a new Land Rover ambulance, shown on the cover of this report, and a network of personal radio recievers used to 'call out' team members to an incident.

Eric Bates died from natural causes whilst on holiday in the Alps. He spent much of his leisure time on the mountains around Keswick.

Team Leaders Report

1991 has been a year of change in the Team. The retirement of our Chairman, Ken Brannan, our Secretary John Wood, and our Team Doctor, Mike Turnbull, after many years of matchless work, has left us with a void, which will be difficult to fill. Also Jo and Harold Watkins standing down from the laborious and time consuming job of looking after our many collecting boxes, will be hard to follow. But I'm sure the new officers filling these vital roles will follow the example set by our departing friends.

The large bequest, left in the will of Mrs Elizabeth Bates has enabled us to purchase our radio receivers, which, supplied to all Team members, have dramatically reduced the response time of the Team. It has enabled us to replace our older Land Rovers and to convert them both to carry stretchers.

With a very comprehensive training and first aid programme weekly, throughout the year, I feel the Team is more than keeping up its very high standard.

We have had 62 call-outs this year—a record. Unfortunately 11 of these were fatalities, but thankfully the vast majority of these calls were for fairly minor incidents, and most have their lighter moments. For example, the time we were bringing a casualty down Mousethwaite Coombe and a freak gust of wind lifted the whole stretcher party off its feet and deposited them 10 to 20 yards down the fellside, fortunately leaving the stretcher and casualty where they were! I suppose you could say this was a lighter moment!

Finally the Team was saddened to hear this week of the death of Eric Arnison. His wise counselling on any of the Team's legal matters and his support and interest in the Team almost from its start in 1947, will be sadly missed.

Statistics

1991 was the Team's busiest year to date, with 62 call-outs, discounting the large number of false alarms. Of these 62 incidents, 11 involved fatalities.

To repeat to some extent the sentiments expressed in earlier Reports, it seems inevitable that, as the number of visitors to the mountains increases, then so will the number of acccidents. The statistics bear this out.

By far the most common incident attended by the Team is a simple slip... resulting in either a broken, or sprained ankle. Last year saw a decrease in the number of climbing accidents, albeit that those that did occur tended to be of a serious nature. Paragliding and mountain bike accidents increased—a trend that appears likely to continue. The wintery conditions of early '91 also resulted in an increase in the number of ice climbing accidents.

The vast majority of incidents attended by the Team arise through no fault of the unfortunate casualty. Most of those rescued express embarrassment which, although understandable, is generally misplaced.

However, it is as well to remember that in 1991, the mountains of the Lake District claimed 27 lives; they therefore demand the attention, and respect, of all those who venture onto them.

Search Dogs

Search Dogs have played a part in the Team's rescue operations for some years. There are currently five Search Dog and Handler combinations in the Team; the Dogs range in age and experience, and are of differing breeds—one German Shepherd, one Labrador, and three Border Collies.

Each Dog works in a similar way, quartering the ground, searching for a human air scent, which it then tracks to its source before returning to its handler, indicating a 'find' by barking. The Dog will then lead the handler to the casualty.

The training of a Search Dog is a long, complex and time-consuming task. SARDA, English Lake District sets high standards which each Dog must attain before being accepted as a 'Graded Dog', ready to go onto the Call-Out List..

Once graded, the Dog and Handler continue to train throughout the Dog's working life of up to 7 or 11 years.

The Keswick Dogs, as well as being used for night and bad weather searches in the local area, are also on call for the rest of the Lake District and the UK.

Incident Report 1991

1	Sun 13th Jan 1425	Old Coach Road, Thelkeld Knotts	A youth (15 yrs) fell from his trials bike and broke a leg.
2	Sun 13th Jan 1529	Head of Barkbethdale, Skiddaw	An observer in Bassenthwaite village reported what appeared to be a body lying in the snow near the summit of Skiddaw. A search both on foot and by an RAF helicopter training in the area, located the "body" - a large protruding boulder!
3	Sat 19th Jan 1525	Scales Tarn, Blencathra	Two experienced ice climbers were nearing the summit of Blencathra, having taken a direct line from Scales Tarn, when the leader fell whilst climbing through the cornice - dragging his companion with him. They were taken by RAF helicopter to Carlisle Infirmary.
4	Sun 20th 1635	Latrigg, Keswick	An orienteer came across a body hanging from a tree. The Team recovered the body.
5	Sat 9th Feb 1910	Raven Crag, Combe Gill, Borrowdale	The calls for-help of an injured ice climbers companion were heard by other walkers who raised the alarm. The injured climber (32 yrs) had fallen 100' while descending after completing a climb. He had received severe head injuries. A difficult rescue hampered by poor visibility, steep ice, snow and darkness.
6	Mon 11th Feb 1545	Sty head Tarn,Borrowdale	A man (30 yrs) slipped on ice and injured his ankle. He was carried down and taken to Keswick Hospital.
7	Thurs 28th Feb 1915	Great Gable area, Borrowdale	Walker (47 yrs) decided to extend his walk due to the good weather. Having exhausted himself, he became lost and benighted. He was located on Moses Trod at 2300 hours.
8	Sun 3rd March 1400	Central Gully, Great End, Borrowdale	Six climbers were swept down the Gully by an avalanche. Most walked away with light injuries. One sustained spinal injuries, a broken pelvis and other injuries. An RAF helicopter flew him to Hexham General Hospital.
9	Mon 4th March 1330	Youdale Knott, Catbells, Borrowdale	A jogger reported hearing whistles. A quick search revealed nothing untoward.
10	Sat 16th 1125	Halls Fell, Blencathra	A hunt follower blacked-out and fell. He was carried down by the Team.
11	Tues 19th March 0900	Langdale to Wasdale	Assisted Wasdale MRT in a search for two middle-aged walkers who had failed to return. They turned up at 1015 hours at Wasdale Head, (just as the Team was setting off), having spent the night on the fells.
12	Tues 19th March 2245	Sty Head, Borrowdale	Two walkers became separated at Sty Head. One got to Wasdale Head, the other was found near Seathwaite in an exhausted and confused state. They were attempting the Coast to Coast walk.
13	Frid 24th March 1435	Castle Crag, B'dale (Irrawaddy, HVS)	Two local climbers fell after their belay failed. One managed to arrest his fall - sustaining no injuries. The other, unable to do so, sustained fatal injuries.
14	Sat 31st March 1625	Helvellyn Gill at the Swirls	A mountain biker caught his chainwheel when riding off the end of a bridge. He fell off into a stream, sustaining serious knee injuries.
15	Sun 7th April 1410	Grisedale Gill, Whinlatter	A man (56 yrs) slipped on steep ground while making a direct descent to the valley to escape from the strong winds. He broke an ankle.

16	Sun 21st Apri 1430	Rosthwaite-Watendlath path, Borrowdale	A young woman was found by other walkers in a collapsed condition with suspected appendicitis. She was detained overnight at Carlisle Infirmary, and later had her appendix removed.			
17	Mon 29th April 1545	Eagle Crag, Greenup Gill, Borrowdale	A man (51 yrs) slipped whilst descending steep ground. He injured his knee did that a series of the reality			
18	Wed 8th May 1100	Mousethwaite Comb, Blencathra	A male walker (45 yrs) collapsed with chest pains. He was taken down by stretcher and transported to Keswick Hospital.			
19	Sun 19th May 1508	Hause Gate, Cat Bells, Borrowdale	A man (60 yrs) collapsed near the summit of Cat Bells. On the Team's arrival, the man was found walking down from the fell accompanied by a Doctor.			
20	Wed 22nd May 1744	Near the Kings Head, Thirlspot	A man (53 yrs) collapsed and died whilst walking near Thirlmere.			
21	Wed 29th May 2150	Spinup, Lower Falcon Crag, Borrowdale	A climber fell whilst seconding the climb, sustaining serious head injuries. He died in hospital one week later.			
22	Fri 7th June 1346	Carrock Fell summit, Blencathra	A competitor in a paragliding competition was dragged backwards along the ground by his chute. He sustained back and leg injuries. He was taken to hospital by RAF helicopter.			
23	Sat 8th June	Sprinkling Tarn area, Borrowdale	A young lady (25 yrs) collapsed with exhaustion. She was carried from the fell by the Team.			
24	Tues 11th June 1850	Whinlatter Forest	A teenage boy was reported overdue on an orienteering exercise. 5 search dogs and Team members were involved in the subsequent search. He had become lost in mist.			
25	Thurs 20th June 1500	Hause Gate area of Cat Bells, Borrowdale	A man slipped and injured his ankle.			
26	Sun 23rd June 0841	Scafell Pike area, Borrowdale	Two boys (16 yrs) became separated from party of 32 while descending from Scafell pike. Asked to assist Wasdale MRT (who had searched throughout the night), at daybreak. The two were found lost, cold and wet at Sampson's Stones in Eskdale.			
27	Tues 25th June 1834	Above Longthwaite Youth Hostel, Borrowdale	A boy (11 yrs) in a school party fell whilst bouldering, breaking an ankle.			
28	Sun 30th June 1628	Langstrath, Borrowdale	A woman (50 yrs) was reported to be in distress with acute abdominal pains. However, she had recovered and managed to walk down before the Team was fully under way.			
29	Wed 3rd July 0004	Greenup Gill area, Borrowdale	Campers, several of them independently, reported seeing a hot air balloon crashing in the Greenup Gill area. An exhaustive search revealed nothing. False alarm with good intent.			
30	Thu 4th 1550	High Spy, Borrowdale	A man (59 yrs) collapsed and died whilst walking. He had a medical history of angina.			
31	Sun 7th 1525	Great Dodd, Helvellyn	A man (39 yrs) collapsed whilst walking with his relatives. On the arrival of the Team, he was found to be dead.			
32	Mon 8th July 1645	Greenup Gill, Borrowdale	A youth (16 yrs) slipped and sprained his ankle while on a D of E expedition. Weather - heavy showers.			
33	Tues 30th July 2300	Raven Crag, Thirlmere	Reports were received from a walker of shouts, whistles and then falling rock, followed by silence. A search of the area produced negative results False alarm with good intent.			


34	Tues 30th July 2315	Castle Crag, Borrowdale	Whilst the previous incident was underway, a report was received of distress torch signals from the top of Castle Crag. A quick search found 2 boys who were bivvying. They had been signalling to their friends on the campsite below.		
35	Wed 31st July 1125	Rogue's Gallery, Shepherd's Crag, Borrowdale	A climber fell 20', sustaining mild head injuries.		
36	Wed 31st July 1930	Slings, Shepherd's Crag, Borrowdale	A solo climber fell 60 feet, sustaining multiple and fatal injuries.		
37	Fri 2nd Aug 2200	Barf, Whinlatter	A man and his family went up to the Bishop of Barf. He was unable to make the descent due to vertigo, subsequently the four of them became benighted. They were walked down by the Tearn.		
38	Wed 14th, 1655	Base Brown, Borrowdale	A man slipped, spraining his knee.		
39	Sat 17th Aug 1320	at 17th Aug Gillercomb, Borrowdale A man slipped and fell 80' whilst climbing the scrambling route on Gillercomb Buttress. He sustained arm.			
40	Wed 21st, 2245	Blea Tarn, Watendlath	A girl on a D of E expedition was reported collapsed, experiencing breathing difficulties.		
41	Sat 31 Aug 0945	Drum House, Honister, Borrowdale	A man collapsed whilst walking. He was dead on arrival of the Team.		
42	Sun 1st Sept 1715	Combe Gill, Glaramara, Borrowdale	An elderly gentleman was unable to walk further due to severe cramp. He was helped down by the Team.		
43	Mon 2nd Sept 1535	Rigg Head Quarries, Borrowdale	A woman slipped and fell, injuring her wrist. She was carried down by the Team.		
44	Frid 6th Sept 2334	Napes, Great Gable, Borrowdale	Two climbers on the Napes were reported overdue. A search commenced. They were found at half past midnight arriving at their car. The leader had fallen, damaging his knee. They made their way down in darkness.		
45	Sat 7th Sept 1622	Ashness Ghyll, Borrowdale	A man fell about 30' while scrambling in the Ghyll. He sustained multiple cuts and bruises, and was carried down by the Team.		
46	Tues 17th Sept 1434	Great End, Borrowdale	A man's body was found at the foot of the eastern end of Great End crags. The alarm was raised direct from the scene by mobile phone. An RAF helicopter training in the area recovered the body.		
47	Wed 18th Sept 1342	Blea Crag, Langstrath, Borrowdale	Reports of whistles and shouts were investigated but nothing was found. False alarm with good intent.		
48	Sun 22nd, 1116	Sharp Edge, Blencathra	A woman fell from Sharp Edge at the awkward step. She sustained multiple and fatal injuries.		
49	Tues 1st Oct 1622	Near Sharp Edge, Glenderamakin valley	A man (26 yrs) succumbed to exposure whilst on an adventure training course. He was carried down in extremely high winds, making the recovery exercise an extremely hazardous undertaking.		
50	Tues 8th Oct 1741	Rosthwaite/Watendlath path	A woman slipped on wet rock and broke an ankle.		
51	Sun 13th Oct 1600	Jenkin Hill, Skiddaw	A man fell whilst running downhill and broke his leg.		

52 Fri 18th Oct 1840	Grains Gill, Borrowdale	A known diabetic collapsed whilst walking. On the Teams arrival, he was found to be dead. In all probability, the casualty had suffered a heart failure.
53 Tues 22 Oct 1840	Foot of Stake Pass, Langstrath,Borrowdale	2 elderly walkers were overcome by exhaustion. They were being helped down by other walkers when met by the
54 Sat 26th Oct 1425	Crag Hill, Braithwaite	A man with a history of angina was reported to have collapsed. He recovered and insisted on walking down when met by the Team.
55 Thur 31, 104	5 Langstrath, Borrowdale	Campers were stranded on an island by the raging river near Stonethwaite
56 Sun 3rd Nov 1230	Bleaberry Fell, Borrowdale	An orienteer slipped and knocked his knee on a rock, breaking a patella.
57 Tues 5th No 1425	Maiden Moor, Borrowdale	A woman slipped on steep wet grass and broke an ankle.
58 Sat 9th Nov 1507	Clough Head, Helvellyn	A paraglider was dumped on the summit by vicious air currents. He sustained a fracture/dislocation of his shoulder and back injuries. Another paraglider broke an ankle and sprained the other whilst going to his aid.
59 Sun 10th No 1455	High Rigg, St. John's in the Vale	A young woman slipped and went out of control down some scree. She collided with three others who all rolled down the scree. Only one casualty - with a broken ankle and abrasions.
60 Sun 10th No 2115	Pavey Ark area, Langdale/Borrowdale, Thirlmere	Requested to assist Langdale/Ambleside MRT in search for 2 men reported overdue on Jack's Rake. 16 dogs and team members searched all night. The men turned up at first light having become lost and benighted at Angle Tarr
61 Tues 3rd De 1915	c Glaramara, Borrowdale	A man and his wife parted ways at Sprinkling Tarn. He failed to return his car. He was found asleep in Langstrath, having become lost and benighted.



Opposite: A selection of the equipment carried by the Team's lead vehicle (I); simulated crag incident (r)







SUMMARY OF INCIDENT TYPES




TIMES OF DAY 1991








DAYS OF THE WEEK 1981-1991


