1	12-Jan	15:13	Walla Crag	A local lady slipped on steep grass while in descent to Rakefoot, injuring her ankle. The team splinted her up before carrying her down on a stretcher to a waiting ambulance, for onward transport to hospital in Carlisle. 26 members - 1 hour 44 minutes
2	14-Jan	15:30	Lonscale Fell	Police requested an investigation after a member of the public reported a strange activity above the snowline on Jenkin Hill. A small number of Team members checked out the report, which eventually turned out to be someone planting trees ! A false alarm with good intent. 8 members - 37 minutes
3	14-Jan	18:00	River Greta area	The previous incident had interested the police because of the possibility of it being a missing lady from the local area. Shortly after, they found the missing person's car, and this triggered a large scale search of the wooded areas surrounding the River Greta, and parts of Latrigg. The search involved the Team, its swiftwater rescue technicians, 10 search dogs from the Lake District Search Dogs, and Cockermouth Rescue Team, tackling some challenging woodland areas, as well as the banks and shallows of the River Greta. The lady's body was discovered in the river just after midnight, and was recovered by Team members. 30 members + 10 LDMRSD Search Dogs and handlers + 15 Cockermouth MRT - 7 hours 15 minutes
4	05-Feb	14:58	Clough Head - Coach Road	A student from an Outdoor Centre group suffered what appeared to be a serious asthma attack, as she got down to the Old Coach Road. The weather was cold and wet, and the group was suffering somewhat from the cold. The Team immediately despatched a first vehicle, and followed it up with a Sprinter which could be used to provide a rewarming facility as well as transport. The situation escalated somewhat when a second student began to suffer the same symptoms whilst the Team was en route, but within a short while the situation was stabilised. The two casualties were taken down by Land Rover to meet with an ambulance at Hill Top Farm, and they were then taken to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. The rest of the group was taken down the hill in the second vehicle to meet up with minibuses from the centre. 20 members - 2 hours 2 minutes
5	16-Feb	10:25	Helvellyn - Swirls path	Two walkers came across a 68 year old male who had suffered a medical emergency which was initially thought to be a diabetic condition, but was later diagnosed as a possible stroke. The Team sent a group of six to support an NNAS paramedic (also a Team member), backed up by a second vehicle, a doctor and another paramedic. Once his condition was established, the North West Air Ambulance was tasked, and it was able to land about 200m from the casualty site. The Team then transported the casualty to the aircraft, and he was flown to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. The Team brought the gentleman's dog off the fell, and this was later retrieved by family members. 20 members - 2 hours 2 minutes
	16-Feb	14:55	Dollywagon Pike	A man requested assistance when his wife slipped and fell on an icy path whilst ascending Dollywagon Pike. Although she was unhurt, she was unable to continue, as they had no crampons or spikes. Patterdale MRT were also called to this incident, but as the teams were mobilising we received word that an experienced and well equipped group of walkers had come across them and assisted them to safety. This incident was therefore logged as an alert. 11 members - 25 minutes
				It may be half term BUT.....Winter is here on the tops. Walkers should go properly prepared for the conditions!
6	18-Feb	17:06	Above Thirlspot	A 46 year old lady slipped and dislocated her knee on a footpath behind the Thirlspot Hotel. An ambulance crew managed to get to the scene, but required the assistance of the Team to stretcher the patient the 300 metres back to the road. She was then taken to the Cumberland Infirmary for further treatment. 24 members - 1 hour 29 minutes
7	19-Feb	16:34	Kings How	A husband and wife out for a walk, mistook the path down from Kings How on the west side, and became cragfast above Bowder Crag. The Team sent out a Land Rover with 6 members, and a further 4 attended direct from home, as the Borrowdale road closure made life difficult. The pair were located unhurt, and assisted from the crag by two Team members down to their transport. The other Team members were then diverted to the next incident which had been running for about 50 minutes. 19 members - 1 hour 59 minutes
8	19-Feb	17:25	High Spy	A 45 year old lady suffered a severe ankle injury, after slipping on wet ground near to Wilsons Bield. The Team diverted the Land Rover from Incident 8 as the situation was well in hand, and that group then went in from the top of Honister. They were backed up by a further vehicle with six more, and some other Team members who accessed the site from Rigg Head. The casualty was treated at the scene, loaded on to the stretcher, and was then carried down towards Rosthwaite. Two Team members recovered the vehicles from Honister, and the lady was then transported from New Bridge to Rosthwaite to await a land ambulance. This took her to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 22 members - 3 hours 53 minutes
9	20-Feb	15:56	Near Rosthwaite	A 47 year old lady suffered an ankle injury when she slipped on steep grass, whilst descending Lingy Bank towards Rosthwaite. An ambulance crew were able to reach her, but needed the assistance of Team members to carry her 300m to the ambulance, which had managed to get as far as New Bridge. She was taken to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 18 members -1 hour 15 minutes
10	08-Mar	14:03	Low Briery	A couple phoned the police to request help to retrieve their dog, which had tumbled down an embankment and was stuck on a ledge just above the river. The Team sent out a group of 5 members, whilst others stood by at base. The group set up a rope system to lower a Team member to the dog. He was able to retrieve it, and return it to its owners. 10 members - 1 hour 21 minutes
11	11-Mar	11:45	Helvellyn - Brown Cove Crags	A couple walking on the main path up Helvellyn encountered ice near the top of the zigzags. Both fell some distance, with the male partner falling over 100m. He suffered head injuries and chest injuries, she got away with cuts and bruises. Fortunately a passing doctor was able to offer assistance, and the Great North Air Ambulance was on the scene very shortly afterwards, and dropped off its paramedic. The Team meanwhile had sent out a first vehicle, and other Team members went direct to Swirls. The Air Ambulance was then able to assist further by airlifting Team members up the hill, to assist in the carry out from the incident scene to the aircraft. The casualty and partner were then flown down the hill, to be taken to the Cumberland Infirmary by road ambulance, as their injuries proved less serious than initially thought. 15 Members - 2 hours 24 minutes
12	12-Mar	05:35	Central Fells	The Team was requested by Wasdale MRT to assist them with a search for a missing walker who had failed to return to his accommodation. Their task was further complicated by the fact that he had left no intended route, which meant there was a huge area to search. Team members plus three search dogs were tasked to search various areas on the Scafell massif and Great Gable. This search eventually involved 7 Lake District teams, and lasted till 1300 hours when a body was seen in a gill by a member of the public. As this was in Wasdale's area, the Keswick team then stood down. 20 members - 7 hours
13	12-Mar	21:35	Derwentwater - Lords Island	The Coastguard requested the Team's assistance in recovering two male canoeists who had become marooned on Lords Island, when one of their boats became waterlogged. Neither of the men were in a fit state to get themselves ashore, so 5 Team members were involved in actually going out with a safety boat from Derwentwater marina, and bringing them back to the launch jetties, where they were checked over by an ambulance crew. 10 members - 1 hour 45 minutes
14	15-Mar	14:50	Greenup Edge	A 66 year old lady suffered an ankle injury whilst walking. The Team responded with a group of 6 initially, and followed this up with a further vehicle. Some Team members went direct to the meeting point. The first group reached the scene at much the same time as the North West Air Ambulance, and assisted the crew to carry the casualty to the aircraft. She was then flown to Furness General Hospital for further treatment. 22 members - 3 hours 20 minutes
15		12:40	Carrock Fell	A 68 year old man became unwell ,with what may have been a stroke, whilst walking on Carrock Fell. The team was requested to attend by North West Ambulance service because of the nature of the terrain. A team of 6 set off in the first vehicle, but fortunately an RAF helicopter from Boulmer was in the area, and was able to offer assistance. The casualty was winched into the aircraft and flown to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 13 members - 1 hour 10 minutes
16 28 - 29 March		20:10	Blencathra	Four mountain rescue teams, 8 search dogs from the Lake District and 1 from SARDA England combined to search for a 64 year old man who failed to return from a walk on Blencathra. Overnight, Keswick team and 6 search dogs combed the main routes up the mountain until 3 am, but without success in very poor visibility. Early in the morning, Keswick team, a further 6 search dogs, Cockermouth MRT, Penrith MRT and a rescue team from RAF Valley who were in the area, took on a search of large areas of the mountain. They were assisted by a Sea King from RAF Boulmer. It was not until 10.30 am that two Keswick Team members spotted something red in a gully north of Sharp Edge, and this turned out to be the body of the missing walker. It appeared he had suffered head injuries in a fall. His body was evacuated by the RAF Sea King. A very sad outcome for all concerned. 23 members overnight, 57 MRT personnel and 9 search dog teams: total duration 14 hours.
17	01-Apr	19:30	Seldom Seen, Patterdale	Patterdale MRT requested use of the Team's Autopulse resuscitation machine. Two Team members and the Team Doctor assisted Patterdale Team members and North West Ambulance Service to treat a lady who had hypothermia after being in a stream. She was airlifted to hospital by an RAF Sea King, but unfortunately succumbed to her condition later. 3 Team members - 2 hours.
18	02-Apr	11:23	Latrigg	A 58 year old man fell and twisted his ankle badly. The Team treated him at the scene, carried him to the Gale Road car park, and he was transferred to hospital for treatment by a North West Ambulance. 13 members - 1 hour 1 minute
19	02-Apr	12:19	Barf	While the previous incident was in progress, a call was received that a 48 year old man had become cragfast on Barf. A Landrover was despatched to Whinlatter as the best access, and the Team members eventually located him in a loose gully where a number of previous accidents have occurred. The Team rigged a rope lowering system, and a Team member recovered him to safe ground without incident. 10 members - 2 hours 2 minutes.
20	06-Apr	13:04	Central Fells	Wasdale MRT requested the deployment of the Team's search dogs to assist in the location of two 3 Peakers, who were missing overnight. Search Dogs Ginny and Meg with their handlers and a navigator set out from Seathwaite in atrocious weather, but were very glad to be recalled after 15 minutes when the missing pair turned up in Eskdale. 4 members - 1 hour
21	08-Apr	18:51	Stonethwaite	A 15 year old student on a Duke of Edinburgh expedition became unwell, and as the ambulance service were unsure as to whether he was on the hill, the Team was called to assist. Fortunately he had managed to reach the road, and was taken to hospital by a North West ambulance. 16 members - 50 minutes.

22	12-Apr	11:40	Stoneycroft Beck, Newlands	A garbled report was received of a male with either leg, back or head injuries who had fallen in the vicinity of Stoneycroft Beck. The Team immediately despatched a Landrover with 5 members to assist, but by the time they arrived the person had been met by an ambulance. The Team stood down. 12 members - 32 minutes
	12-Apr	14:50	Dollywagon Pike	The Team was alerted to a hypothermia case on Dollywagon Pike. Fortunately, Patterdale MRT were also alerted, and they were engaged on a practice with a helicopter, which was able to lift their Team members to the scene. Keswick then stood down.
23	14-Apr	10:29	Sour Milk Ghyll, Borrowdale	North West Ambulance requested assistance with a 71 year old man who had fallen and suffered a leg injury, whilst climbing a stile just above Seathwaite Farm. The Team sent one Landrover. with one of our paramedics attending direct to the scene. Initially, an Air Ambulance was despatched to collect the gentleman, but in the light of other pressing calls, a land ambulance transported him to the Cumberland Infirmary. 8 members - 2 hours 2 minutes
24	19-Apr	13:31	Great Gable-Aaron Slack	A 51 year old lady slipped and fell, breaking her wrist in the process. Initially the call went to Cockermouth MRT, but as it transpired, the group were on the Keswick side of the hill. A Landrover with 5 made its way to the top of Honister, and one of the Mercedes ambulances went to Seathwaite. At this point, the Great North Air Ambulance was tasked, and flew to a point very close to the injured lady. She was able to walk to the aircraft, and was flown to West Cumberland Hospital for treatment. The team was in ignorance of most of this, as communications were extremely difficult with much interference, and it was only when the aircraft was seen taking off, that the Team was eventually paged to inform them to stand down. 12 members - 3 hours 27 minutes
25	20-Apr	12:27	High Rigg	A 44 year old lady walking with family slipped near Wren Crag, and suffered a leg injury. The Team treated her at the scene, and then stretchered her down to the road. She was transferred to an ambulance for onward transport to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 17 members - 1 hour 35 minutes
26	21-Apr	15:19	Cat Bells	A 10 year old girl, descending with her family, had a fall and injured her ankle to the extent that she was not able to weight bear on it. (This injury later turned out to be a fracture. The Team attended with two vehicles, and she was splinted at the scene, and then stretchered down to the track below. One of the Sprinters then took her to rendezvous with an NNAS ambulance, which took her to the Cumberland Infirmary for further treatment. 19 members - 1 hour 41 minutes
27	25-Apr	14:34	Eagle Crag, Langstrath	Shouts for help were heard by a member of the public in the vicinity. A Team was sent to investigate, joined by some of the local members others stood by at base. The incident turned out to be friends shouting to each other as they descended which was misinterpreted. It was recorded as a false alarm with good intent. 18 members - 56 minutes
28	26-Apr	14:49	Blencathra, Blease Fell.	A 9 year old boy running down out of control, cartwheeled and dislocated his elbow, above Middle Row Farm. He was treated at the scene by a paramedic, and stretchered down to the road where he was transferred to an ambulance. He was taken to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 19 members - 1 hour 26 minutes
29	28-Apr	12:59	Ravenglass Estuary	Wasdale Team requested assistance to search for a missing 76 year old man who had been seen struggling in the water of the estuary with his dog. The dog managed to make its way ashore, but the man disappeared. Wasdale requested whatever swiftwater technicians could be made available to search after 4 pm when the tide turned. Two vehicles with the necessary equipment left the base at 1500 hours, and other Team members who had been training on swiftwater in Wales joined them at the scene. This incident was attended by about 60 rescue personnel from a number of agencies including the Coastguard, RAF, Police divers, and four other rescue teams. Unfortunately, no trace was found of the missing person, and the Teams were stood down from about 1900 hours. His body was recovered some 2 weeks later. 11 members - 7 hours 54 minutes
30	30-Apr	14:33	Great Round How	A 64 year old man fell and split his knee open badly. As the incident appeared to be on the border between ourselves and Cockermouth, both teams were despatched. The gentleman was located close to Great Round How, and the Teams shared the task of recovering him by stretcher to Honister. Fortunately, Penrith MRT had tasked a Sea King to an incident, and this was able to come and winch the casualty aboard. He was flown to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 17 members - 3 hours 6 minutes
31	14 - 15 May	22:34	Central Fells	A 67 year old man failed to return from a walk to Scafell Pike from Seathwaite. The Team, assisted by Wasdale MRT, Lake District Mountain Rescue Search Dogs and an RAF Sea King searched the main routes on the mountain, but were unable to locate him by 0400. The Team re-assembled at 0800 to continue the search, this time with assistance from Duddon, Cockermouth, Penrith and Wasdale teams and search dogs. With low hill cloud, a helicopter was not immediately available. The man's body was found in Piers Ghyll by a Wasdale group at 1040. He had suffered major fatal injuries. Members of the Team assisted Wasdale and Cockermouth teams to extract the casualty from a very difficult location, and an RAF helicopter evacuated him. The recovery took nearly 5 hours. 26 members + 5 search dog teams + 4 rescue teams - 16 hours 17minutes
32	17-May	11:51	Raven Crag Buttress	A lead climber fell from the first pitch of Raven Crag on Glaramara, and suffered serious head injuries. As the Team was in base for an Open Day, the first vehicle was able to leave for the scene within two minutes, swiftly followed by a second. Also, fortunately an RAF Sea King was in the area, and was able to assist with the rescue. Despite the strenuous efforts of other climbers at the scene, and the Sea King paramedic, he was pronounced dead by the receiving hospital. 22 members - 3 hours 40 minutes
33	20-May	13:47	Manesty	An 83 year old man tripped over a tree root and injured his hip. The Team despatched a Landrover, and two other local Team members attended direct. The Team splinted him at the scene, and then carried him to the Great North Air Ambulance which had arrived in the meantime. He was flown to the Cumberland Infirmary at Carlisle for treatment. 14 members - 1 hour 30 minutes
34	22-May	17:34	Calf Cove	A 14 year old female student walking with a school group suffered a dislocation of the kneecap, and was immobilised. As the group were high on the hill and at risk from hypothermia, the Team mobilised a large number of members and made their way up to the location. The North West Ambulance service requested an RAF Sea King to attend, though this had to land on some distance away because of low cloud at the incident site. The young lady was splinted and given analgesia, and then carried about 400m to the waiting helicopter. She was then flown to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 25 members - 3 hours 46 minutes
35	23-May	15:22	Walla Crag	A 75 year old lady stumbled on loose stones coming down the side of Cat Ghyll, and injured her ankle. The Team sent a Land Rover to the Great Wood car park, and a number of members attended direct. She was splinted at the scene, and then stretchered down to meet up with an ambulance, which took her to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 17 members - 1 hour 43 minutes
36	31-May	13:30	Helvellyn range	The Police requested the Team to assist in the search for a missing 61 year old gentleman who had failed to return to the hotel where he was staying earlier in the week. A needle in a haystack! If he had gone out walking, he had left no notice of his intentions. The last recorded mobile phone pings suggested that the western flanks of the Helvellyn range from Clough Head to Brown Cove crags might be a possible area to search, so the Lake District Search Dogs were deployed to cover the gills, and a police helicopter to look into the steeper crags and ravines. Regrettably, after 3 hours, the man's body was spotted by the observer in the police helicopter below Lower Man in Brown Cove. Team members recovered his body, with assistance from search dog handlers and members of Penrith MRT. 19 Members + 5 Search Dog handlers + 4 Penrith MRT - 8 hours 15 minutes total
	31-May	15:52	Helvellyn	While the previous incident was in progress, the Team was alerted to a couple missing from an organised walk for several hours. Fortunately they put in an appearance at their vehicle within 5 minutes of the call, so no resources were expended.
37	31-May	21:43	Sty Head to Seathwaite path	An 18 year old female, walking with a group, turned her ankle badly. To their credit, the members of her party tried to carry her down, but were overtaken by darkness. The Team, who had just cleared up from incident 36 went out again, and stretchered her down to Seathwaite, assisted by the same members of Penrith MRT. She was collected by an NNAS ambulance and taken to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 15 members + 4 Penrith MRT - 2 hours 35 minutes
38	02-Jun	12:27	Barf - Slape Crag	An 81 year old lady, walking on her own, misplaced the footpath up from Thornthwaite to the summit of Barf, and got into some very difficult ground just below Slape Crag. Here she became cragfast, and decided she needed assistance. Rightly so, as this is an area where a number of serious accidents have occurred in recent years. The Team sent out a small group, approaching from above and below, and located her fairly quickly. She was assisted up to the next level with a rope, and then pointed in the direction of the summit. The Team then returned to base - all hoping that they would be as fit and determined to reach the top at 81! 15 members - 2 hours 11 minutes
39	08-Jun	11:59	Barf - Slape Crag	A 37 year old man encountered difficulties very much in the same location as the previous week's incident. By the time a team member had reached him, he had largely sorted himself out and had started making his way down the scree. He was accompanied back down to terra firma! 19 members - 1 hour 6 minutes
40	14-Jun	15:49	Birkside, Nethermost Pike	A 32 year old young lady twisted her knee while descending the steep, rocky path, aggravating a previous injury. Some other walkers managed to carry her down some distance, but the steepness of the zigzags required help from the team, which lowered her down, using ropes on the steepest sections. She was then taken by ambulance to Carlisle for treatment. 14 members - 3 hrs 30 minutes
	17-Jun	16:33	Shepherds Crag Borrowdale	A lady attempting the North Buttress, slipped off the first pitch and suffered an ankle injury. The Team sent two vehicles, and Team members administered analgesia and First Aid. She was stretchered down to the road, and loaded into an NNAS ambulance for transport to the Cumberland Infirmary. 18 members - 1 hour 29 minutes
42	20-Jun	10.44	Black Crag Borrowdale	A 49 year old lady climbing Troutdale Pinnacle, took a 60 feet (18m) fall, and suffered a major complicated fracture of her leg. The Team responded immediately with two vehicles, and requested both Air ambulance and RAF Sea King support, Until the Team arrived on scene ,it was not clear whether the casualty was on the crag or on the ground, but she turned out to be on the third pitch of the route. Fortunately she was reasonably accessible and one of the Team's paramedics and the Team doctor were able to reach her to administer both First Aid and analgesia. The crew of the two supporting aircraft conferred, and it was agreed that the RAF Sea King would winch her direct from the crag. She was then flown to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 19 members - 2 hours 29 minutes.

43	20-Jun	13:48	Castle Rock Thirlmere	Just after the Team had finished clearing up from the previous incident, the pagers went off again. This time, a 47 year old man had fallen 6m from the crag, hitting his head in the process. He was treated as though he had a spinal injury as he had landed on his head. The Sea King from the previous job was still at Carlisle, and it was requested to come and repeat its party trick from the morning. The Air Ambulance also attended to assist with the medical treatment. The casualty was flown to the Cumberland Infirmary by the Sea King. 15 members - 1 hour 58 minutes
44	21-Jun	15:31	Gillercombe Head	A 57 year old female walker taking part in a charity event, suffered knee trouble which rendered her unable to continue. The Team, with assistance from Cockermouth team members who had just completed a rescue in Buttermere, attended, and she was stretchered to Honister. She was then handed over to the event organisers to arrange further treatment. 22 members + 6 CMRT - 3 hours 11minutes
45	21-Jun	17:30	Grisedale Pike - Sleet How	Whilst the previous incident was in progress, the Team was asked to recover the body of a Newfoundland dog which had collapsed on Sleet How, apparently with heat exhaustion. A small group drove a Landrover up through Whinlatter Forest to retrieve it, and handed it over to the owners. 5 members - 2 hours 5 minutes
46	30-Jun	12:04	Ashness Bridge, Borrowdale	A 44 year old man slipped on the edge of Ashness Ghyll, and suffered a severe ankle injury. The Team attended and gave him analgesia, before one of the Team paramedics realigned the ankle to prevent worsening of the injury. A splint was then applied, and he was stretchered up to the road. An ambulance then attended to take him to the Cumberland Infirmary for further treatment. 12 members - 1 hour 36 minutes
47	08-Jul	08:46	Thirlmere	The Team was asked for help in releasing a terrier, which had managed to get itself stuck down a hole under a boulder in the Thirlmere woodland. A team went out with a variety of digging and lifting equipment, only to find that the dog had self-rescued a few minutes earlier! 6 members - 32 minutes
48	14-Jul	16:28	Latrigg	A 62 year old male slipped on the path and heard a crack in his ankle, after which he was unable to weight bear. Fortunately we were quickly able to get our Land Rover quite close to the incident. We immobilised his ankle and took him to the local hospital for onward transport by ambulance to Carlisle. 19 members - 1 hr 12 minutes
49	19-Jul	14:29	Whinlatter Forest	The Team were requested to assist an ambulance crew in recovering a 32 year old female patient. She had come off a mountain bike, whilst negotiating a boardwalk in the forest. She had landed on her back, hitting a tree stump, and was in considerable pain. After analgesia had been administered, the Team managed to lift her back on to the boardwalk, and thence on to the stretcher. She was then carried to the ambulance, and taken to the Cumberland Infirmary for treatment. 15 members - 1 hour 6 minutes.
50	20-Jul	17:40	Latrigg	A 74 year old lady walking with a friend became exhausted not far from Latrigg summit, and was unable to continue. The Team attended, and located her part way down the ridge towards Brundholme. We were able to get the Land Rover very close, and gave them a lift down to their transport. 13 members - 58 minutes
51	21-Jul	15:50	Borrowdale - Shepherds Path	A 74 year old lady fell and suffered a leg injury, whilst descending the path from the Watendlath Road to High Lodore. Fortunately for her, the Team Leader was instructing a group of youngsters on Shepherd's Upper Crag, and was quickly on the scene. The Team was alerted, and within a short space of time, two vehicles were on scene at Shepherd's Cafe, and the team members making their way to the incident site. The lady was splinted and given analgesia, and then carried down to the Team vehicles. She was transported to Keswick Cottage Hospital where she was transferred to an ambulance for onward transport to Carlisle. 18 members - 1 hour 45 minutes

The casualty and his wife were winched aboard, and flown to the Cumberland Infirmary. 16 members - 3 hours 34 minutes
103	30-Nov	16:15	High Rigg	A 26 year old lady, walking with friends, slipped and fell, aggravating a previous back injury. There were plenty of Team members responding, so two vehicles were despatched to St Johns in the Vale church, and the rescuers made their way up to the summit. The casualty was given analgesia, and then splinted in a vacuum mattress to prevent further injury. She was then stretchered down to an NWAS ambulance, and taken on to the Cumberland Infirmary for further treatment. 21 members - 1 hour 54 minutes
104	04-Dec	14:52	Above Wythburn Church	A lady fell and broke her arm whilst descending Helvellyn. The ambulance crew requested assistance to recover her to the ambulance. The Team immediately sent one vehicle to assist the crew of the Great North Air Ambulance who were quickly on scene. A second vehicle backed them up, as the casualty had to be carried up the hill after splinting, to be put on board the aircraft. All this took place in glorious sunshine, with excellent visibility.
